WINTER CLOTHING GRANT

Renfrewshire Council will make a £50 winter clothing payment to parents and carers of children and young people attending primary or secondary school who have received a school clothing grant this school year (from August 2023).

This payment will help families buy additional winter clothing and is part of a wide range of support for people during the cost-of-living crisis.

Anyone who has already applied for a school clothing grant, you do not need to apply again.

People who haven't applied and receive a qualifying benefit should apply by Friday 20 October to get both a school clothing grant and the \pounds 50 winter clothing payment. There is help and support available for anyone who needs it.

Any parent can make an appointment with the new Schools Support Service run by Renfrewshire Citizens Advice Bureau. Search "Money advice service in secondary schools" on the Renfrewshire website or call 0141 889 2121. Alternatively, please call your young persons Pupil Support teacher for assistance.
