

Changes to Curricular Structure



- Last session we changed the structure of our curriculum, which mainly affects S3 and S4 pupils
- We increased the pathways, options and qualifications available in S3 and 4 pupils to better meet the needs of our pupils
- We Increased wider achievement opportunities for all pupils, including accredited wider achievement

What does this mean?



- Instead of choosing 6 subjects (plus English Maths and core subjects) at the end of S2, pupils choose 5 subjects
- Pupils do not have to drop one of their subjects at the end of S3, but instead continue to study the same subjects for 2 year (S3 and S4)
- This allows for more depth of learning in the 5 chosen subjects and for wider achievement

Why were the changes made?



- To increase opportunities for attainment and achievement for all pupils
- To provide more flexible pathways to meet the needs of all learners
- To increase pace, challenge, enjoyment and depth of learning
- To increase our focus on skill development and relevance of learning to future life and work

Senior Phase Progression



S3 and S4

Pupils choose 5 subjects across curricular areas plus English and Maths and core subjects.

Pupils will develop skills and knowledge across their subjects and work towards Qualifications and awards in these subjects. Pupils will also have opportunities for accredited wider achievement.

Flexible and vocational pathways will be available to meet the needs of all learners.



Pupils will build upon their skills and knowledge from S3 and 4 in undertaking further National qualifications and awards relevant to their postschool pathway.

Pupils will continue to have opportunities to develop their leadership skills and for accredited wider achievement





What is the SCQF?

- It's Scotland's lifelong learning framework designed to help people of all ages and circumstances to access appropriate education and training over their lifetime, so as to fulfil their personal, social and economic potential
- It helps people understand qualifications and how they relate/compare to one another
- It helps people plan their learning and provides a mechanism for making better informed choices
- It recognises people's learning and gives them credit for what they've achieved. This means that it can support credit transfer

850 other qualifications in addition to SQA, university degree, Apprenticeships and SVQ qualifications are on the SCQF




93% of programmes at SCQF Level 6 are not Highers



- 20 credits at SCQF level 7
- If applying to an eligible degree programme at UWS equates to a B at Higher
- Offered to those interested in applying to university who may need advice with study pathways, support with the application process or their qualifications may fall slightly short of the typical entry requirements
- UWS campus visit in June
- 10 weeks of school-based learning with UWS tutor
